Record numbers at the 2017 School Holiday Fun Day

Rock climbing, mini golf and hip-hop demonstrations were just three of the countless activities on offer at Mission Australia Housing's School Holiday Fun Day in Blacktown in October. The day aimed to engage and connect families living in community housing properties in the local area – and it did just that.

More than 600 children and families came together under blue skies at the Blacktown International Sports Park – which was double the number of attendees at last year's event. With the help of 70 community partners, the event was entirely free to attend, giving families the opportunity to participate in fun activities during the school holidays, a welcome relief for tenants who may be under financial stress.



This year Mission Australia Housing worked with Evolve Housing and SGCH to make the extravaganza happen. Mission Australia Housing Executive Chris Bratchford said the event was hugely successful in fulfilling the brief of 'having fun, getting active and living healthy!'

'We know that it can be challenging for some young people to achieve their potential if they don't have access to early intervention and the ongoing support they need. All young people deserve a chance to unwind and have fun during their school holidays, regardless of their background or family circumstances. This fun day is one way we can work together to build a stronger community for the young people and families who live here,' Chris said.

The day offered something for everyone. From netball clinics with a Sydney Swifts netballer, rock climbing, softball, mini golf and NRL football workshops to 'Obstacool' courses, jumping castles, cheerleader and hip hop demonstrations and cultural performances.

Based on successes like these, the three Community Housing Providers are already joining forces to make the 2018 School Holiday Fun Day bigger and better than this year's event!

From our Executive



In October I had the pleasure of attending the School Holiday Fun Day extravaganza co-produced with Evolve Housing and SGCH in Blacktown. Having run this event for young people and their families over the past three years with Evolve Housing, we are proud to be part of this new collaboration of three of the largest Community Housing Providers in the area.

In the last newsletter I mentioned that we were chosen by the NSW Government to transform Ivanhoe estate at Macquarie Park in Sydney. One of Australia's largest social and affordable housing developments, it will create more than 3,000 much needed new dwellings.

In addition to this I am very pleased to announce that Mission Australia Housing was awarded an additional 1,050 properties to manage on the Mid North Coast of NSW. With these two projects combined, our footprint will more than double in NSW.





Meanwhile, in Tasmania we have partnered with property developers Ronald Young & Co Builders to identify land within the Clarence Plains social housing precinct to build social, affordable and market homes for the community. We have already started construction of two of the social homes.

Although it only feels like yesterday, it is Christmas time again! Already festive lights and decorations are beginning to adorn home windows and front yards but more importantly, it is time to celebrate with our loved ones.

This can also become an expensive and exhausting time of year for some. Remember that gifts do not always have to cost you money. Community gardens all a buzz

Tenants at the Colyton complex in GWS were very pleased to have their community garden and project finally completed. The project, part of the Social Community Housing Improvement Fund (SCHIF) saw the installation of a shade area with table and seating, a garden shed to store tools and beautiful raised vegetable gardens. Our partner, Royal Sydney Botanical Garden, Community Greening Coordinator provided much appreciated weekly workshops and planting guides.

Over the past few months tenants have been busily attending to the garden. The vegies have grown and Colyton now has a relaxing space for everyone to meet and have a cuppa in a beautiful setting. One tenant commented 'It's nice to be able to have your family over in a very nice outdoor setting'. Everyone is looking forward to reaping their first crop of organic tomatoes.

Meanwhile in Coffs Harbour on the Mid North Coast tenants at the West High Street complex have shown fantastic initiative and built their own Community Garden.

An area of land on the property was cleared by Mission Australia Housing to host the garden, and tenants jumped right on in, putting in garden beds, plants, and decorations. Most of the garden was provided by tenants or sourced by tenants from the community, including donations of woodchip from Coffs Harbour Council.

Margaret, who started the project, said that it has been 'great to get out in the sun and do the gardening that tenants have not been able to do before.'

Housing Manager, Jocelyn Box, is very impressed with the work the tenants have done and says,

'It's a fun and quirky garden. This is what a sustainable community looks like. The tenants have made most of the decisions; they have been the drivers of the work. They have made new friendships, learnt new skills, and are committed to looking after the space together.'

There are only 5 rules for the garden and they involve respect, being helpful to others, and gardening organically.

Margaret, a passionate gardener, sourced tips from friends and found out how to get help from Council. 'They came out and had a look and really liked it. They have now delivered a few loads of wood chip for us.'

Tenants have planted passionfruit, corn, herbs, beans, spinach and much more. There's even a pineapple on its way. 'It's the benefit of living in Coffs Harbour, pretty much anything will grow' said Margaret.

There is a gazebo, seating, a worm farm, and compost bins for scraps, all donated or sourced by tenants. 'We've learnt a lot on the way' said Margaret, while Catherine commented that tenants are already eating from the garden. 'Now it's daylight savings, it has been a great space to **sit in the evenings together'** she said. Not just about growing vegies, Poly, another happy tenant, commented that because of 'some very talented tenants it is now possible for all of us to socialise together which we didn't have before. Now we can come out to the garden and have a chat and a cup of tea together.'

Quick and easy Christmas lunch stuffing




- 10g unsalted butter

Over the past few months, Lily Keenan has been painting up a storm on one of the roof top garden areas at Common Ground

Originally from Western Australia, Lily is a freelance artist who now lives and works in Sydney. Inspired by patterns found in the human body, botany and tales from myth and legend her intricate and sometimes strange works are partly scientific and partly created by the imagination.

Well known for her murals from Bondi to Nicaragua, Lily's works raise awareness around the environment, climate change and developing communities. Her ultimate vision is to use art as a tool for environmental justice and social cohesion.

The World in Colour adorns the city scape at Common Ground. Bringing the peace of nature back in to the lives of residents this mural was made possible through the NSW Governments' Social Housing Community Improvement Fund.

'Creating this mural for **Common Ground was a** wonderful experience. It was great to see it come together over many weekends, and really get to know tenants and staff in the process. This is probably the largest mural I've ever created, and quite an ambitious design to paint by hand! It tells a visual story of transforming a bleak urban world into a place of organic shapes, light and colour. I hope people feel hope and optimism when they are enjoying the garden, sunshine and colourful story of this mural!'
